Mather Receives "A" Rating from The Leapfrog Group

Mather Hospital received the top "A"

rating for patient safety from the Leapfrog Group in the latest ratings period. Mather was the only Long Island or metropolitan area hospital to achieve that distinction. Less

than 5 percent of all New York State hospitals received an A grade, and Mather was one of only 832 hospitals nationwide that achieved the top score. Previously, Mather had received the "A" rating in nine out of the last 11 rating periods.

"I congratulate our nurses, physicians, board members and every employee and volunteer who helped us achieve this score," said Mather President Kenneth Roberts. "Patient safety, nursing excellence and quality care are top priorities at Mather Hospital."

Developed under the guidance of a Blue Ribbon National Expert Panel, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses 27 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to assign A, B, C, D and F grades to more than 2,600 U.S. hospitals twice per year. It is calculated by top patient safety experts, peer reviewed, fully transparent and free to the public.

The Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade assigns letter grades to hospitals based on their record of patient safety, helping consumers protect themselves and their families from errors, injuries, accidents, and infections.

HANYS Auxiliary of the Year





Mather Hospital's Auxiliary was recognized for "outstanding achievement and service within its healthcare facility and community" with the Auxiliary of the Year Award, Large Hospital Category, from the Hospital Association of New York (HANYS). The award was presented on Oct. 26 in Albany at HANYS' 51st Annual 2017 Institute for Healthcare Auxiliaries and Volunteer Leaders. HANYS established the Auxiliary of the Year Award to recognize numerous ways that auxiliaries help strengthen New York State's healthcare system.

Since its founding in 1949, the Auxiliary has raised more than \$6 million through its fundraising activities - the Thrift Shop, Gift Shop, lobby vendor sales, raffles and events such as the Thrift Shop Fashion Show. The award noted that in 2016 the Auxiliary contributed \$210,000 to support the needs of the hospital's Environmental, Engineering, and Nutritional Services departments, and its members gave 30,000 hours of their time

running the Thrift and Gift Shops and assisting throughout the hospital.

Brain & Spine Tumor Program Offers Advanced Treatment

Mather Hospital's Brain & Spine Tumor Program offers advanced diagnosis and treatment of tumors by a team of specialists that meet with the patient together in one location to determine a care plan.

"With all these modalities to provide patients with high-level neurology and neurological surgery care in their community, they don'thave to travel far," said Dr. Sumeer Sathi, a neurosurgeon and Co Director of Mather's Brain & Spine Tumor Program. "They can have these things taken care of - including complicated spinal or brain surgery and tumor surgery – without having to go from doctor's office to doctor's office. The care is organized in one location.

"This is a unique center on Long Is-

From 2014-2016, Mather experienced an 85 percent increase in neurosurgical brain and spine

procedures done at the hospital.

"The biggest advantage to the Brain & Spine Tumor Program is that the patient meets with all their specialists together in the same place at the same time. This allows for a quicker assessment and planning," said Medical Oncologist David Chu, a medical oncologist and Co Director of the Brain & Spine Tumor Program. "The patient meets with a medical oncologist, a radiation oncologist, and the neurosurgeon at one visit and not through multiple visits spread over two or three weeks."





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
